

THE CALIFORNIA COMMISSION ON DISABILITY ACCESS MAILING LIST REQUEST

The California Commission on Disability Access (CCDA) was created through the enactment of Senate Bill 1608 (Chapter 549, Statutes of 2008) whose role is that of an independent 17 member advisory body representing the Legislature and the business and disabled communities. The CCDA efforts are intended to facilitate business compliance with applicable disabled access laws, building standards and regulations, and most importantly, to reduce and, if possible, avoid unnecessary litigation. The CCDA role is diverse, and includes being an information center for the status of compliance with disabled access law and regulations; providing proposals and recommendations to the Legislature regarding legislation; conduct and publish studies relative to specific problem areas and develop recommendations, and report on the effectiveness of the CCDA efforts; and is tasked with the development of a master checklist for disability access for proposed use by enforcement officials and design professionals.
